

GARBAGE GUIDELINES

REMODELING & CLEANING DEBRIS

For small jobs, please cut all wood and drywall into sizes that fit in the dumpster. Never leave drywall or boards with nails where children can reach them. If you plan to do major cleaning or remodeling and your debris will fill an entire dumpster at once, call the office to provide a dumpster, at your expense. Standard dumpsters are for everyone's use and should never be filled by just one household.



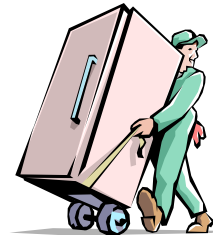
IF THE TRASH FITS....

Anything smaller than the dumpster itself should be disposed of in a dumpster. This includes windows, toilets, televisions and cabinets. These items, when left on the grounds, are dangerous and unsightly. Cabinets and large boxes should be flattened to save space. Always put all garbage inside the bin, not on the grounds, especially pet litter.



APPLIANCES & FURNITURE

Appliances, furniture and other items too large to fit in a dumpster may be placed out near the dumpster only on a pickup day or night before. Call the office to confirm pickup days. Remove refrigerator doors for safety. Securely tape shut the doors of all other appliances. Please do not block any sidewalk or driveway.



ROLL & TIE CARPETING STRIPS

Cut carpeting into strips no more than 48 inches (four feet) wide, then roll it tightly, tie with twine and place into a dumpster. Wet carpet is very heavy. The scavenger service is not required to take loose carpet left on the ground.



RECYCLE GLASS, METAL, PLASTIC & NEWSPAPER

You can continue to keep garbage costs down by bringing all metal cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic, newspaper and cardboard (up to 36" x 36") to the recycling bins at the end of Cove Drive. The recycling service will not accept Styrofoam or large glass or metal items like windows or appliances.



HAZARDOUS WASTE

Watch City newsletters for hazardous waste pickup dates or call SWANCC. Do not put car batteries, flammable fluids or items that could endanger scavenger crews in the dumpster.
